5	Objective	<p>A major activity taken up is the <i>Kisan Melas</i> (Farmers Meet) where in farmers from the surrounding villages gather together. The main purpose of this is to serve as a platform for exchange of knowledge, experience amongst farmers themselves. Our staff provides this platform for a farmer to interact with other farmers where the farmer talks about their experiences while implementation of activities or any new activities that they have taken up as well along with the outcomes, impacts and economics of these activities wherever applicable. In addition practical demonstrations are conducted during such events. The practical demonstration further strengthens the confidence of the participants to go in for the particular activity. This acts as a motivational factor for the farmer himself as well as other farmers who can take up these new initiatives.</p> <p>This also acts as a platform for advertizing the achievements of the Community Development Project in the time interval. Dignitaries from all walks of life participated in the <i>Melava</i> including from the funding agency MOIL, the important figures from the village Panchayats and the village community as a whole.</p>
